A Signature Members' show is up at the Coastal Maine Botanical Gardens through July 15th. Please look it up when you go to the Gardens.Thank you to all who participated. Our activity day was on May 28, with a kids (6) workshop taught by

Barbara Farchione, and an adult (11) workshop taught by Diana Rogers. They were well received. The reception spread put on by the Gardens was fabulous. Many thanks to Arts Coordinator Caroline Davis and her staff, and the culinary staff. And thanks to plein air painters Lisa Regopoulos and Jeff Fioravanti for painting in the gardens.

Barbara Farchione awards a \$750 PSME scholarship to MacKayla Giles, graduating from the Sanford High School, going into Art education at Utah State University. Congrats to Mackayla and thanks to Barbara for reinstating this good program.

A few of our members will attend the IAPS Biennial Convention this month. 


Winter Harbor
