# You are the reason for the Society, and in the coming year we wish to reflect your interests in 2024 events.

Your **voted slate of officers** includes me as president, Terrilynn Dubreuil as vice president, and Elizabeth Hunter as secretary.

Our treasurer position is open - We need someone, by March 1<sup>st</sup>. Your consideration is greatly appreciated. Here is treasurer Susan's message:

The Treasurer position time commitment varies according to Society activities but does require year-round focus. Monthly duties include monitoring banking transactions (checks, PayPal, SquareSpace, Stripe), recap to bookkeeper at month's end, Treasurer's Report prepared from the bookkeeper's monthly workbook, forwarding that report to the Board. Familiarity with Excel is extremely helpful.

Generally, in conjunction with shows and workshops, duties include handwritten checks, bank deposits from registrations, refunds as needed, and processing sales commissions. Tax returns, 1099s, and requesting and sending five reciprocal Pastel Society awards in the Spring are needed. Bookkeeper Mary McVey will flag if something is missed.
