President's Message

Dear Pastel Society of Maine
Members,

I hope each of you is enjoying this lovely season!

As our PSME Board suggested in July, I've compiled an overview of the Board of Directors, Officers and Chairs, and their various responsibilities. Please take a few minutes to read them.

Mandatory by our 501(c)3 status, President, Vice President, Treasurer, Secretary, elected by the members, appointed for 1 year terms at the year end annual board meeting.

Society Members may cast one vote for these positions at the annual meeting. They are presented as a 'slate of officers' for the vote. Officers are the governing body of the corporation.

Chairs are appointed positions by the Board for 1 year term, appointed at the first meeting of the new year, by the Board. They manage specific activities of the organization.

To ensure the Society continues, we need personnel for the year 2022:

Treasurer – Sara Ostrov will help train a new treasurer to work with a hired bookkeeper. Duties will be greatly streamlined, as the bookkeeper will manage most of the work, and create reports.

International Show Chair (1/ year)

Awards Chair (for 1 international show and 1 member show)

Workshop Chair (1-2/year)

Programs Chair (2-4/year, actual or virtual)

Signature Member Show Chair (annual or biannually)

Chairs may invite a committee or group of people for projects.
Chairperson is the Board representative.

I've served as president and Chairman of the Board of Directors for 3 + years. I have been giving mixed messages about resigning, so let me say this - I like the cool things we have developed, and a Society can do that and more. I must make a change now, to free up some time and for my health.

My **2022 proposal**: If **elected as PSME president**, my role will be:

PSME Lending Library


One of the benefits of PSME membership is your eligibility to borrow

The Big Book of Painting Nature in Pastel (Practical Art Books)


